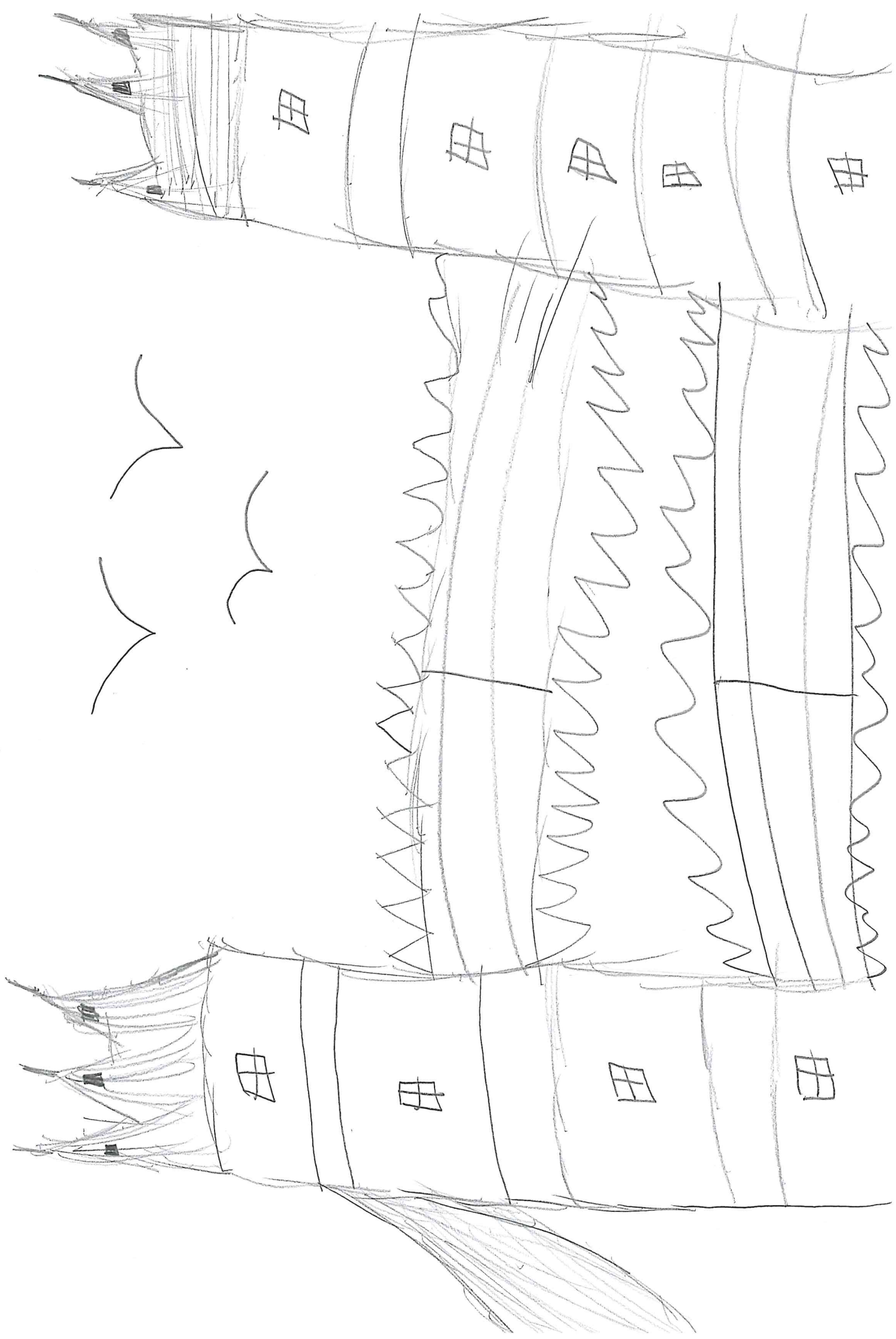


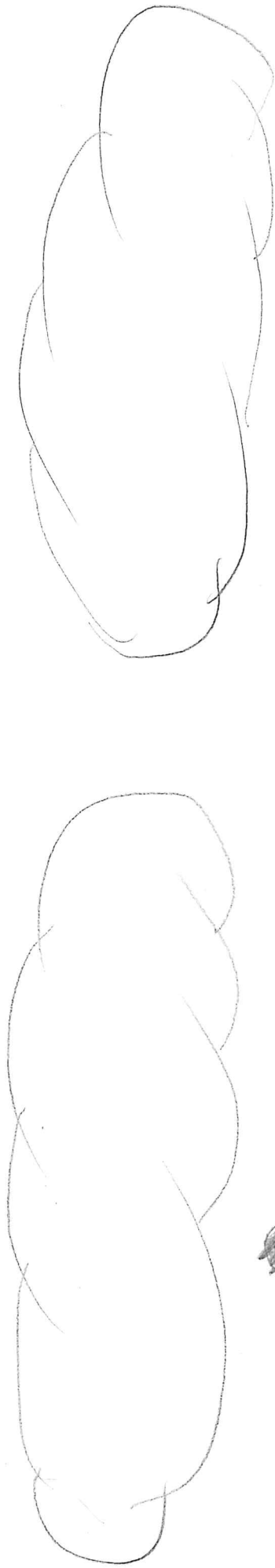


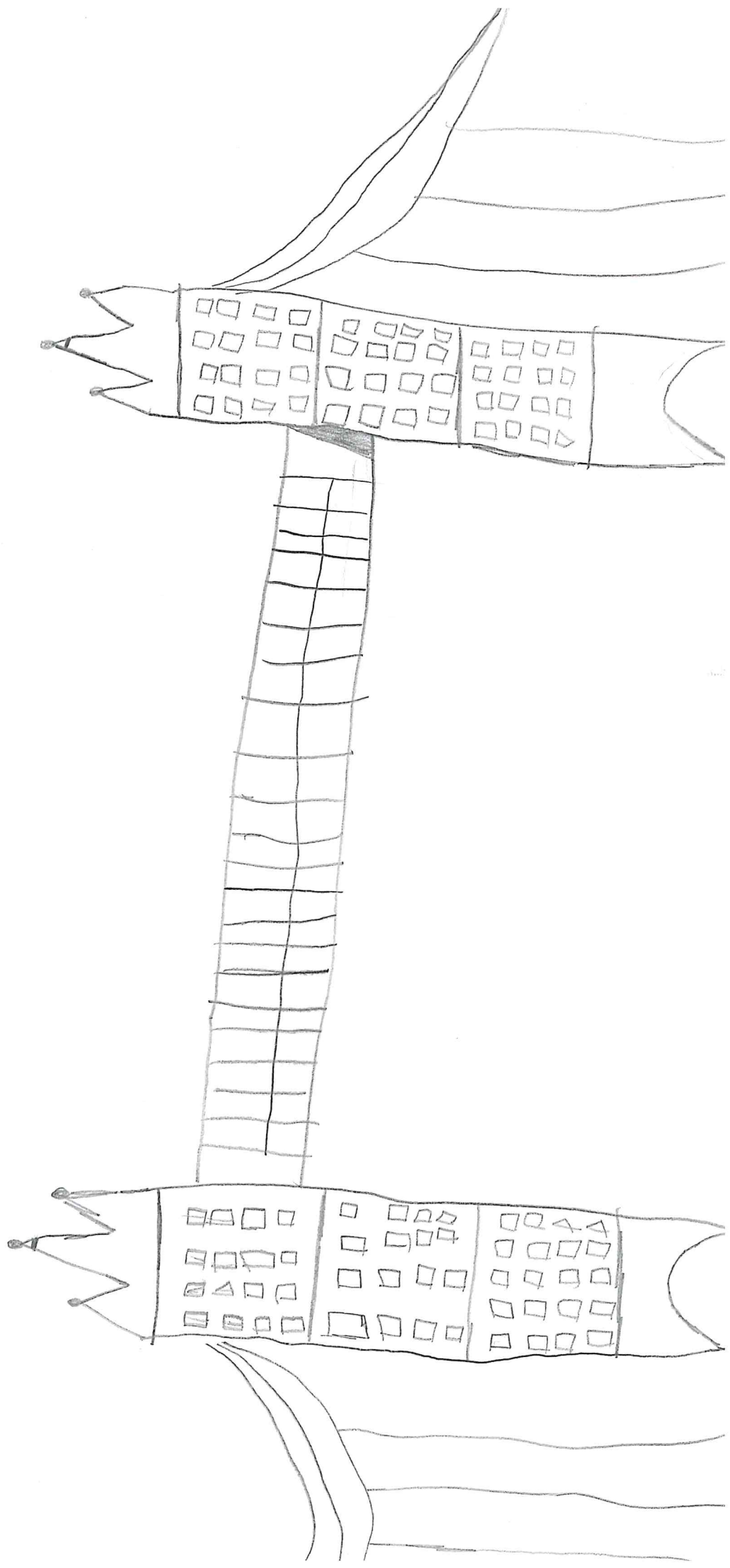












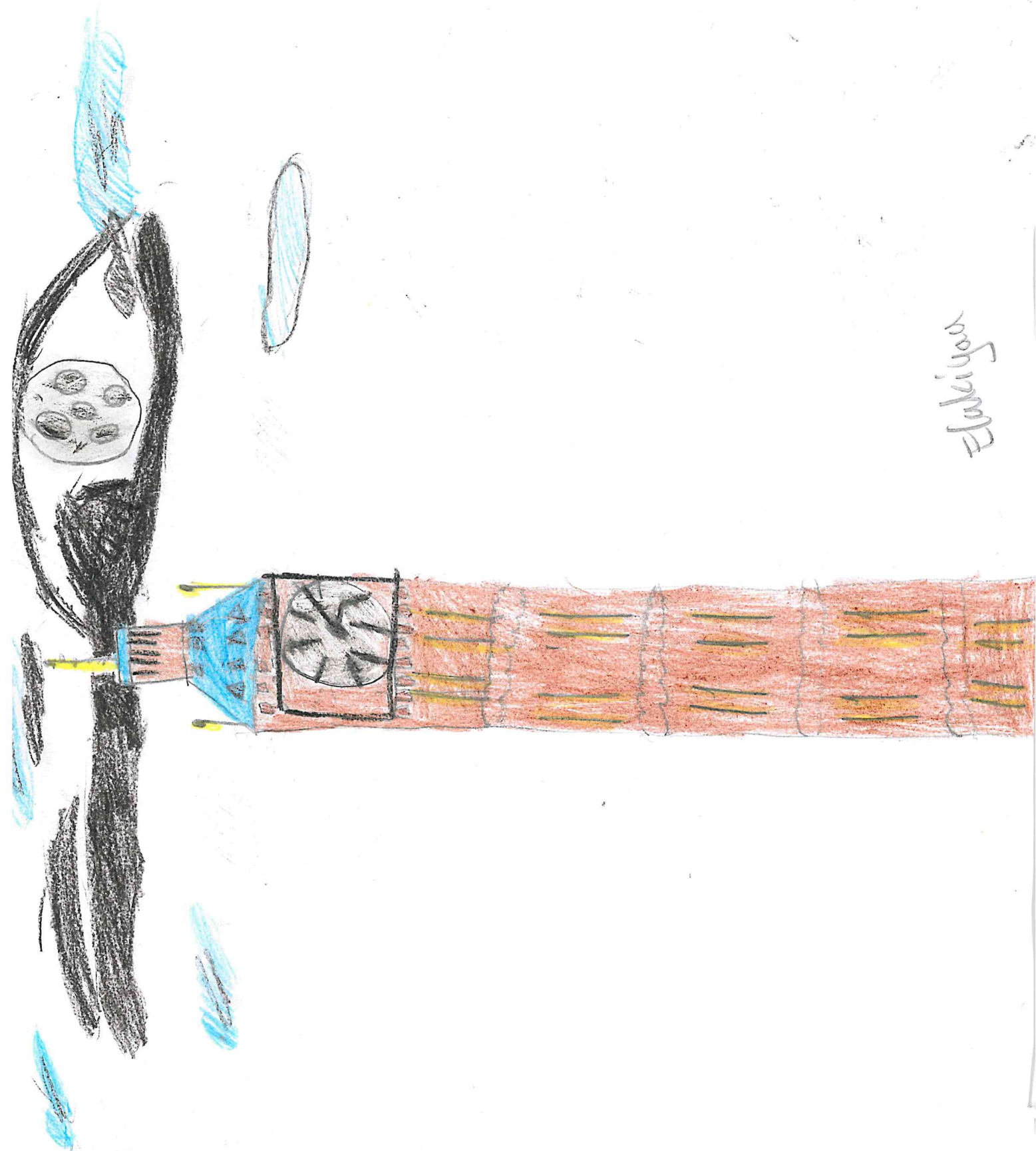


The Houses of Parliament are some of the most important buildings in the UK.

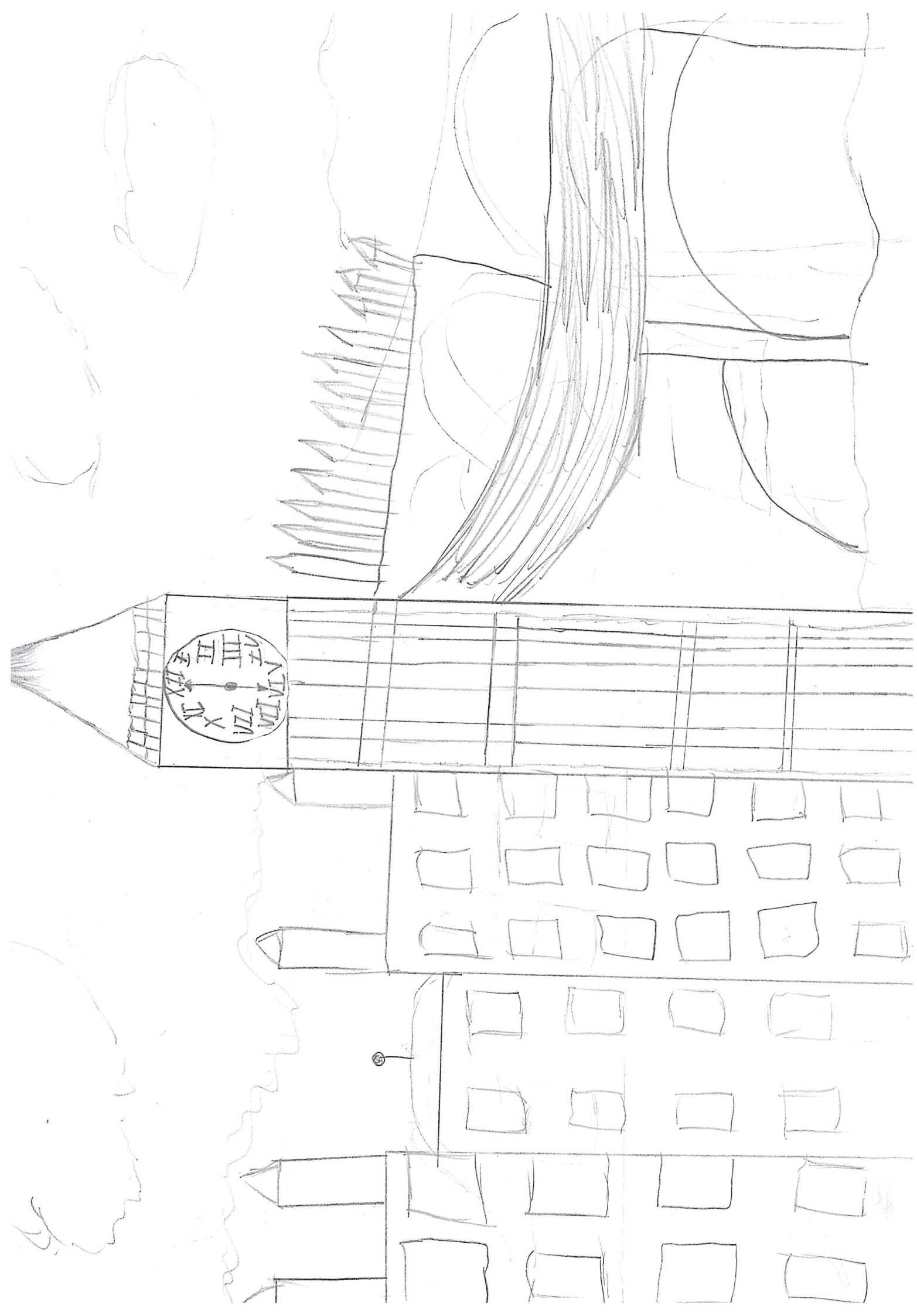

The Houses of Parliament, also called the Palace of Westminster, was one a royal palace. The last monarch to live here, Henry VIII, moved out in 1512.

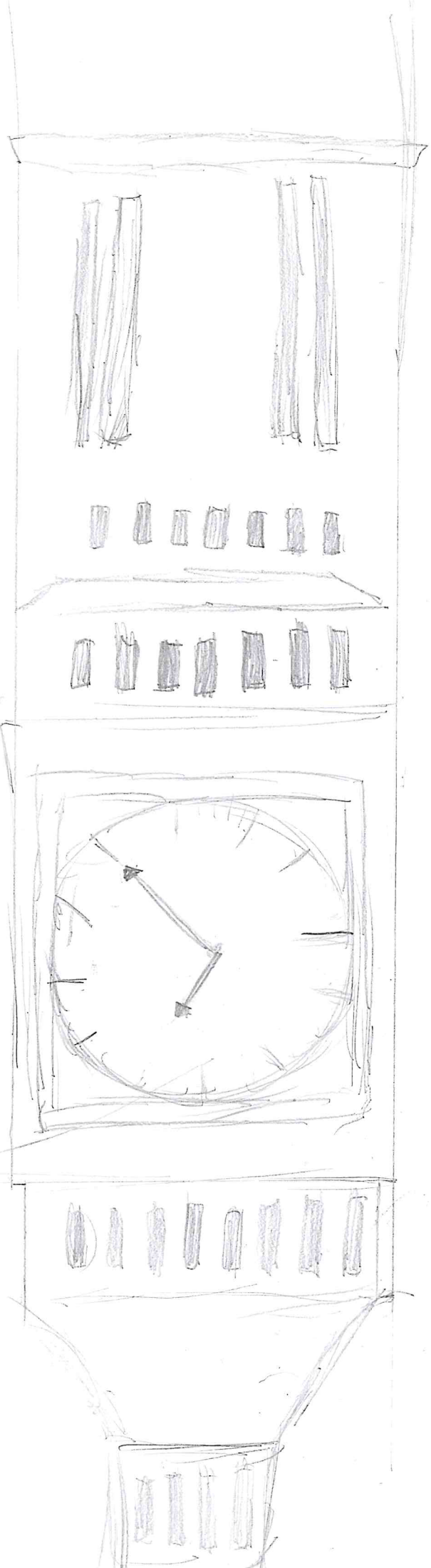
